Alarm Permit Renewals

If you have a security alarm on your home or business, you can now renew your annual alarm permit online at alarmpermits.georgetown.org. The annual alarm permit registration is \$25. Paper applications also are available at alarmpermits.georgetown.org or stop by a City office to pick one up.

Citizen Police Academy

The Citizen Police Academy is a 10-week course taught by police officers. The Academy provides an inside view of the Georgetown Police Department. The curriculum includes laws and code of criminal procedure, criminal and accident investigations, weapons, crime scene investigations, victim services, hostage negotiations, gangs, officer safety, and the court system.

Classes are Thursdays from March 26 through May 28. Sessions are 6 to 8 p.m. in the training room at the new Public Safety Operations and Training Center at 3500 DB Wood Road. Download an application at cpa.georgetown.org or stop by the Police Department. The deadline to apply is March 13. A background check will be conducted on all applicants, who must be 18 or older.

organic material. Containers marked as "yard" also can be used. A maximum of 20 bags, bundles, or containers can be picked up per collection.

Tax Return Help

Public Library

Through tax day on April 15, volunteers will offer free and confidential tax preparation assistance at the Georgetown Public Library at 402 W. Eighth Street at these times:

Tues. and Thurs., 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. Wednesdays, 12 to 4 p.m. Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Volunteers will help prepare e-file or mail-in returns, prior year returns, amended returns, or extensions and help you find answers to tax questions. Bring a copy of your return from last year if possible since, for e-filers, the AGI number (bottom line on front of 1040/A/EZ) is your verification PIN for this year. This volunteer service is provided without regard to income level. Appointments are on a first-come, first-served basis.

Williamson County Financial Stability Coalition

Free and confidential tax preparation help is available from IRS-certified preparers to those who qualify. No appointment is necessary.

The Williamson County Financial Stability Coalition, a community-wide effort led by United Way of Williamson County, is sponsoring the assistance. IRS-certified volunteers will be available to the elderly and households earning less than \$53,000 in 2014 across Williamson County. Taxpayers are eligible to have their 2014 federal income tax returns filed at no charge at these sites in Georgetown:
