## Watering Limit: Two Days per Week

The City of Georgetown is limiting outdoor watering to two days per week and directing customers not to irrigate from noon to 7 p.m. each day. The limits were effective as of October 14.

Based on a request from the Brazos River Authority—which manages the water in Lake Georgetown and Stillhouse Hollow Lake—the City of Georgetown and three other water utilities enacted phase 1 of their Drought Contingency Plans on October 14. The following water use limits apply for City of Georgetown water customers.

For irrigation systems and hose-end sprinklers, landscape irrigation will be limited to a schedule based on the last digit of your address number:

### Odd addresses

Tuesday and/or Saturday


### Even addresses

Wednesday and/or Sunday

No sprinkler or irrigation system use is permitted on Mondays, Thursdays, or Fridays.

Watering with a sprinkler or irrigation system is not permitted from 12 noon to 7 p.m. each day.

Watering with a hand-held hose or bucket can be done any day and at any time. Vehicle washing or filling a swimming pool can be done any day at any time.
