FM 1460 Project Breaks Ground Construction on the FM 1460 project gets underway in November. The two-year project by the Texas Department of Transportation involves building a four-lane road in the 3.5 mile segment from Quail Valley Drive to University Boulevard.

FM 1460 is a key north-south arterial between Georgetown and Round Rock. Currently FM 1460 is a twolane road with no shoulders. The new four-lane road with turn lanes will provide increased safety and mobility between the hospitals and higher education facilities in Round Rock and residential and employment areas in Georgetown.

project. The total cost of the project is \$34.7 million, including \$13 million from the City of Georgetown, \$11.4 million in federal funding, \$7.8 million in state funding, and \$2.6 million from the City of Round Rock and Williamson County.
