Fun Run and 5K on Saturday, February 7

20th Annual Cupid's Chase



Register now for the 20th annual Cupid's Chase 5k and Fun Run on Saturday, February 7. The chip-timed 5k run/walk begins at 8 a.m. in downtown Georgetown at Seventh and Main streets and ends at the Bark Park on Holly Street. (A shuttle will take you back to the starting line.)

For the 5k, registration received on or before January 12 is \$18 for those 13 or older and \$16 for seniors (55+) and children 12 and under. January 13 through February 4, the registration cost is \$22 for all age groups. Registration at packet pickup and race day is \$25 per person for all age groups.

The Kids Fun Run for children age 8 or younger starts at 7:30 a.m. The course is a loop around the Courthouse. Registration is \$10 on or before February 4 and \$15 on race day. T-shirts are not guaranteed if you register on race day.

Participants receive a Cupid's Chase Love 'Em or Leave 'Em T-shirt, while supplies last. Dogs on a leash are always welcome on the Cupid's Chase course.



Pet License

All dogs and cats living in Georgetown are required to be licensed each year through Animal Services. An animal that is picked up, but has a license tag, can easily be identified and returned home. Think of the license as a free ride home for your cat or dog.



The annual cost for each spayed or neutered pet is \$5. The license fee for an unaltered cat or dog is \$20 per year. There is no fee for seniors 65 or older with a cat or dog that is spayed or neutered. Proof of current rabies vaccination is included in the licensing requirement.

The license can be purchased at your veterinarian or at the Georgetown Animal Shelter, 110 W.L. Walden Street—near the McMaster Athletic Fields on N. College Street. The annual license form can be downloaded from the shelter website and mailed in with the payment. See **pets.georgetown.org** for the form and more details about pet licenses.

Art Center and Marketing Downtown Awards

The Georgetown Art Center and the City of Georgetown's Most Beautiful Town Square in Texas marketing campaign were winners of statewide awards last fall from the Texas Downtown Association.



Georgetown were in the category of cities with populations above 50,000 residents.

The Georgetown Art Center won in the Best Public Improvement category that recognizes excellence in public projects and planning in downtowns or commercial districts.

The Most Beautiful Town Square in Texas marketing campaign began in 2011 and is used in a variety of marketing and tourism initiatives.
