### **GoGeo rolls out in August**

Georgetown's new GoGeo bus system officially starts service on Monday, Aug. 21. Come to a ribbon cutting at 1 p.m. at the central transit hub at the Georgetown Public Library, 402 W. Eighth St.

GoGeo has four routes with service hours from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday. An unlimited daily pass is \$2 and an unlimited monthly pass is \$30. Reduced fares are available with ID for those who are disabled, veterans and active military, age 65 or older, or students. Children 12 and younger with a full-fare rider can ride for free. Monthly pass and credit card purchases can be made at the Public Library. Exact change is needed for a daily pass purchase on the bus.

GoGeo paratransit service in Georgetown for those who are disabled is scheduled by appointment. Go to **GoGeo.Georgetown.org** for information on applying for GoGeo paratransit service.

The transit system is funded by rider fares as well as funds from the City of Georgetown, Georgetown Health Foundation, and Capital Metro. For routes and for more information, visit **GoGeo.Georgetown.org**.

### **Vacation thermostat setting**

Are you leaving for summer vacation? Before you leave, don't forget to set your programmable thermostat. No matter how long you will be away, whether a few days or a few weeks, setting your thermostat up a few degrees can help you save money on your energy bill.

# Georgetown Public Library Sculpture exhibit through Sept. 22

The Texas Society of Sculptors is holding its 10<sup>th</sup> annual summer show in the Georgetown Public Library, 402 W. Eighth St. from June 25 through Sept. 22. This exhibit, hosted by the library with sponsorship from the City of Georgetown Arts and Culture Board, showcases 85 works of art by 34 artists, including Psychobilly Hell Bass by John Mark Luke and Library Girl by Vera Smiley. Most of the pieces in the exhibit are available for purchase.

This year, a new award - the People's Choice Award - will be given based on votes by library visitors. Ask a library staff member for a ballot and vote for your favorite pieces. The winning sculptor will receive a cash prize.

Additionally, a sculpture demonstration will take place in the library lobby on Saturday, Sept. 16 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Several of this year's featured sculptors will demonstrate their techniques and processes in clay, bronze, wood, metal, and stone.
