City Maps Available

Water and Electricity Use Jumps

Daily water consumption for Georgetown water customers increased from 18 million gallons in early June to more than 30 million in July. That's an increase of nearly 70 percent. Energy consumption increased 18 percent. Given these big jumps in water and electric use, customers may see a significant increase in their utility bills.

"This is a pattern we see each summer," says Leticia Zavala, customer care director for Georgetown Utility Systems. "When high temperatures hit the upper 90s or 100-degree mark, then utility bills reflect that a few weeks later."

During the hottest summer months, about 75 percent of the drinking water produced each day is used for lawn irrigation.

A few simple steps can help reduce your monthly bill. Here are some ways to save:

- · Set your irrigation system to water only two days each week.
- Drop two or three minutes on the zone run times on your irrigation controller.
- · Set your thermostat to 78 degrees or higher.
- Install a programmable thermostat that adjusts the temperature when you are not there.

Sidewalk Improvements

A number of new sidewalks and new ADA sidewalk ramps are planned for 2017. Projects include improvements in Old Town, along Austin Avenue, and at signaled intersections throughout the city with \$2.2 million in proposed projects for 2017.

In July, the Streets Department made improvements to sidewalks along Seventh Street at Maple Street. The new sidewalk will provide an ADA accessible route for a Southwestern student who lives nearby and uses a power chair. Projects in 2017 will include many other locations to improve ADA accessibility. Funding for sidewalk projects was approved by Georgetown voters in the 2015 transportation bond election.
