Protect Aquatic Life

It's that time of year - is your pool ready for summertime? The City needs your help in protecting the San Gabriel River and the Edwards Aquifer from harmful chemicals used in pool maintenance. Storm drains lead directly to local streams and rivers and chemicals that get added to pools for maintenance purposes are toxic to fish and other aquatic life. Some of these chemicals include chlorine, bromine, algaecides, biocides, water conditioners, and stabilizers.

Dechlorinating your swimming pool prior to emptying it is more than just a good idea, it is required by City ordinance.

To dechlorinate your pool, you can 1) allow the water to sit in the sun for three to four days without adding fresh chlorine, 2) use a chemical dechlorination additive, or 3) discharge the water into your yard and allow it to percolate into the ground. For the last method, which is preferred, be sure that the chlorine residual is zero first and check to make sure you won't flood the yard of your neighbors.

Lawn Irrigation

Heading into summer, it's always important to make sure you are watering your lawn properly. Too much or too little watering causes short root growth while proper watering promotes deep root growth, giving you a healthier lawn. Fortunately, Georgetown Utility Systems is here to help. If you have an in-ground irrigation system for your lawn, you can receive a \$75 rebate (credited to your utility bill) for having your system checked out by a licensed irrigator. Georgetown Animal Shelter

FREE SPAY/NEUTER CLINIC FOR CATS

Did you know that the city of Georgetown Animal Shelter offers three free spay/neuter clinics each year for city residents and their pet cats?

In order to participate, you must:

- Have at least a 3-month-old kitten/cat
- Be a city resident and provide proof (i.e. driver's license or utility bill)
- Schedule an appointment
- Have a hard plastic cat carrier (no wire dog crates, please)

The service includes a free spay/neuter procedure, rabies vaccine, a city license, nail trim, and injectable pain medication and antibiotics by the vet at the shelter. Other low-cost services include FVRCP combo vaccine for \$5, feline AIDS and leukemia test for \$20, microchip for \$10, and e-collar for \$10. Any additional services must be paid for with cash or check.

This is the sixth year that the shelter has offered free spay/neuter clinics for cats and it seems to be making a difference in the number of kittens ending up at the shelter.
