2030 PLAN UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who participated in the On the Table event on Oct. 2, as well as those who took the first 2030 Plan update survey.

In total, more than 1,450 people were a part of great conversations helping to outline Georgetown's future. Also, 1,460 people took the first public survey for the 2030 Plan update. The major themes that emerged from On the Table and the survey are: maintain the family-oriented, small-town feel, continue to encourage high-quality development, enhance citizen participation and engagement, focus on housing and affordability, enhance economic development opportunities, maintain and expand existing parks and recreation amenities, and improve and diversify the transportation network.

This was the first opportunity for the public to help shape Georgetown's future. Be on the lookout for opportunities to continue to participate in early 2019.

## Georgetown Animal Shelter maintains no-kill status

For the fourth year in a row, the Georgetown Animal Shelter has achieved a live outcome rate above 90 percent, which means it is considered a no-kill shelter. The save rate was 94 percent for the fiscal year that ended on Sept. 30.

The live outcome rate is notable for an open-admission public shelter. Factors of the 94 percent live outcome rate include

a high rate of animal adoptions, the number of animals returned to owners, and the cleanliness of the shelter which results in healthy animals.

## OTHER NOTABLE MILESTONES FOR THE 2018 FISCAL YEAR INCLUDE:

- A record 29 percent of animals returned to their owners, including 384 dogs and 64 cats
- 888 animals, or 57 percent of all impounded animals, adopted or transferred to rescue groups
- 648 cats and dogs vaccinated at low-cost vaccine clinics
- 113 cats spayed or neutered at the free spay/neuter clinics for cats and the animal shelter's public assistance program
- 213 volunteers recorded 7.036 volunteer hours
