#### **City Center grand opening**

Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate the grand opening of City Center on March 26. The new civic campus, which includes the new City Hall at 808 Martin Luther King Jr. St. and Council and Court building at 510 W. Ninth St., centralizes several offices that were in buildings scattered throughout the city. In addition to providing needed facility space, the campus features public art installations, including a glass tile mosaic titled "El Arbol (The Tree)" by artist J. Muzacz and "DayScape Wonder" by artist Kevin Greer in the Council and Court building lobby, as well as "Bluehole Park" by artist Mike McConnell in the City Hall lobby rotunda. The City Hall lobby also features rotating quarterly art exhibits sponsored by the Georgetown Arts and Culture Board. The first selection features art by local artist Carol Light.



#### **New irrigation schedule**

#### MANDATORY TWO-DAY PER WEEK WATERING SCHEDULE

In April, Georgetown City Council approved a new two-day watering schedule that is now in effect. This schedule applies to all Georgetown Utility Systems water customers using an automatic irrigation system. Violations of the watering schedule may result in fines.

1, 5, 9	Tue. and/or Fri.
2, 4, 6, 8	Wed. and/or Sat.
0, 3, 7	Thu. and/or Sun.

As always, there is no automatic irrigation allowed on Mondays. This day is reserved for system recovery and maintenance.

### **Recycling participation count**

The City of Georgetown is counting how many residents participate in the City's residential curbside recycling program. The count will take place June 16 through 30.

The City reviews residential recycling each year in June to ensure the service is meeting the needs of the community. Each morning, staff will count the number of recycling carts at the curb to determine how many people participate in recycling, if there are enough collection trucks, and what changes need to be made to increase participation.
