Shelter maintains no-kill status

GEORGETOWN ANIMAL SHELTER

With a save rate of 94 percent for the fiscal year that ended on Sept. 30, Georgetown Animal Shelter has been able to maintain its status as a no-kill shelter for the fifth year in a row. Shelters with a live outcome rate above 90 percent are considered no-kill shelters.

The live outcome rate is notable for an open-admission public shelter. Factors in the 94 percent live outcome

rate include a high rate of animal adoptions, the number of animals returned to owners, and the cleanliness of the shelter which results in healthy animals.

OTHER NOTABLE MILESTONES FOR THE 2019 FISCAL YEAR INCLUDE:

- More than 25 percent of animals returned to their owners, including 328 dogs and 41 cats
- 807 animals, or 61 percent of all impounded animals, adopted or transferred to rescue drops
- 619 cats and dogs vaccinated at low-cost vaccine clinics
- 73 cats spayed or neutered at the free spay/neuter clinics for cats and the animal shelter's public assistance program
- 132 volunteers recorded 7,064 volunteer hours
