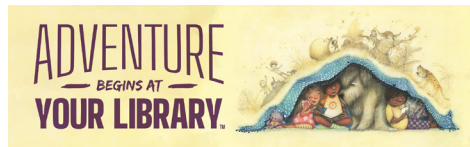


Juneteenth in Georgetown

The Georgetown Juneteenth Festival, sponsored by the Georgetown Cultural Citizen Memorial Association, is 11 a.m.-4 p.m., Saturday, June 15. The event is at the Georgetown Community Center, 445 E. Morrow St. in San Gabriel Park. A pedestrian parade in San Gabriel Park is also planned for 10:30 a.m. June 15. Juneteenth marks the day on June 19, 1865, when Union soldiers landed at Galveston and reported that the Civil War was over, and slavery had ended. Water conservation plays a key role in keeping our treated water capacity readily available in summer months. Georgetown Water Utility customers remain in one-day-per-week Stage 2 irrigation restrictions.

Other things to know about watering:

- Restrictions apply to all water customers, including commercial and residential. No one is exempted from these restrictions.
- Low-output watering methods, such as handheld watering and using a watering can/bucket, are still allowed any day of the week.
- There is no irrigation allowed between 7 a.m.-7 p.m. any day.
- Drip irrigation is allowed on your irrigation day within the allotted 12-hour time frame of midnight-7 a.m. and 7 p.m.-midnight.
- Don't forget, no irrigation is allowed on Mondays. This gives our system a chance to recover after the busy weekend.
